




Race Demographic




Gender Demographic




Age Demographic




Model: Likeliness of being a Democrat




Do you consider yourself a Democrat, Republican, or Independent?




Favorability: Texas State Legislature




Favorability: Texas Public Schools




Favorability: Texas Non-Profit Public Charter Schools






When it comes to issues related to education and schools, whom do you trust most?




Do you support a measure that would increase funding for all public schools in Texas?




Would you support proposals to expand access to more educational choices within the public education system, including magnet schools, career academic and public charter schools?




